

WHAT SHOULD YOU STUDY FOR GAT

- QUANTITATIVE ABILITY: This sub-test is designed to test the quantitative ability of the candidates. The sub test consists of questions on Addition, Multiplication, Division, Fractions, Percentage, Rate of Interest, Work and Task, Ratio and Proportion, and Distance.
- 2) COMMUNICATION ABILITY: This sub-test is aimed at testing the language ability of the candidates in day to day communication in English. It includes questions on synonyms antonyms, words with corresponding meanings, singular, plural, one word substitutes, idioms and phrases, correct spellings.
- 3) ENGLISH COMPREHENSION: This sub-test is to test one's ability to comprehend a situation from a given passage etc.
- 4) ANALYTICAL ABILITY AND LOGICAL ABILITY: This subtest is designed to test the candidate's capacity for inference and logic from the given information and to evaluate the candidate's ability to identify the given problem and apply reasoning in solving the core issues of the problem. Concepts and practice of creative and lateral thinking are likely to be useful.
- GENERAL KNOWLEDGE AND CURRENT AFFAIRS: This sub-test is designed to test the candidate's general knowledge and current affairs.

The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) Prelims primarily evaluates each candidate on the following abilities:

STAGE 1: THE DAT PRELIMS CONSISTS OF TWO PARTS

Part I: MULTIPLE-CHOICE QUESTIONS.- This part has questions with one or more than one correct answer. The responses of this part will be recorded on an OMR sheet and evaluated digitally.

EX- Which colour of the frame represents highest temperature? Ans- Blue

Part II: SUBJECTIVE QUESTIONS, with responses to be provided in visual and/or written formats.

Ex- Draw a woman with a child crying in his arms. Candidates should note that appearing for the DAT Prelims or being ranked in the shortlist does not guarantee automatic entitlement to admission.

STAGE 2: DESIGN APTITUDE TEST (DAT) MAINS

Candidates shortlisted after the DAT Prelims will be invited to appear for DAT Main exams at Ahmedabad or at all campuses of NID viz Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Gandhinagar, Kurukshetra, Vijayawada, Madhya Pradesh and Assam. Exact details of the Test Centre will be mentioned in the DAT Mains Admit Card. The number of candidates shortlisted will be no less than three times the number of seats available per category in that programme.

The DAT Mains for these programmes may consist of tests in multiple formats such as in a studio set up drawing/sketching, hands-on model making, group discussions, presentations, theme based tests, Interviews and Portfolio Interactions.

FINAL MERIT LIST:

The final common merit lists for the B.Des. will be generated category wise (Open, OBC-NCL, SC, ST, PWD), based on the sum total of the weighted scores obtained by the candidate, namely the DAT Prelims and DAT Mains.

- For Indian Nationals in General Category and General EWS Category below 20 years of age as on 1 July.
- For Indian Nationals in Reserved Category (Other Backward Class-Non Creamy Layer (OBC-NCL), Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) below 23 years of age as on 1 July.
- For Indian Nationals in PWD Reserved Category below 25 years of age as on 1 July
- For Foreign Nationals in Overseas (Supernumerary) Category below 20 years of age as on 1 July.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:

Applications for current academic year are open to applicants who have passed or will appear for higher secondary (10+2) qualifying in any stream (Science, Arts, Commerce, etc.) from any recognized board of education such as CBSE, IB, ICSE or their equivalent.

In addition to satisfying the above age criteria, the candidate must possess at least one of the following minimum qualifications to be consid-

ered eligible for admissions:

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:

Bachelor Degree of minimum 4-year duration in any specialization, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard from any university or institute recognized by law in India.

Condition: Candidate must have appeared in all subjects by 30 June 2024*.

OR

Full-time Diploma of minimum 4-year duration in Design/Fine Arts/Applied Arts/ Architecture, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard, from any university or institute recognised by law in India. Condition: Candidate must have appeared in all subjects by 30 June 2024*.

OR

Bachelor Degree of minimum 3-year duration in any specialization, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard. Condition: Candidates must have passed the 3-year Bachelor degree examinations by August 2023.

All applicants applying for the M.Des. programme (any discipline) must fulfill criteria of both age and education qualification.

UCEED is conducted by Indian Institute of Technology Bombay. UCEED is open to all nationals (Indian/Foreign). Candidates seeking admission to the Bachelor Degree programme in Design (BDes) at Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IITB), Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD), Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (IITG), Indian Institute of Technology Hyderabad (IITH), and Indian Institute of Information Technology Design and Manufacturing Jabalpur (IIITDMJ) must appear for UCEED. Candidates should note that the mere appearance in UCEED or being in the rank list neither guarantees nor provides any automatic entitlement to admission. UCEED qualified candidates will have to apply separately for B. Des admissions as per the prescribed procedure. Admissions shall be made in order of merit in each category. Qualifying in CEED alone does not guarantee admission to any of these programmes. Admitting institutes may conduct further tests and / or interviews for the final selection / admission. A CEED score does NOT Guarantee admission. Admitting Institutes will also verify the eligibility, the category certificates and other documents along with the CEED score. The CEED score is valid for a period of one year from the date of declaration of the result.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates must have completed a degree/diploma/post graduate degree programme of minimum THREE years (after 10+2 level), or must be appearing for the final examination of such a program by July 2023, or must have passed the GD Arts diploma programme (10+5 level) by July 2023.

CoA has further decided to conduct the test twice a year, thus giving opportunity to those students who miss out the first test due to some reason or other and to improve upon their NATA score in the first test by re-appearing the second test and provide them admissions to the 5 year B.Arch, Degree Program at all recognized Institutions all over country. NATA measures the aptitude of the applicant for specific field of study, i.e. Architecture. The test makes an assessment of drawing and observation skills, sense of proportion, aesthetic sensitivity, Mathematics at 10+2 level and critical thinking ability that have been acquired by the candidate over the past few years and are related to the specific field of study.

SYLLABUS

Outline of Aptitude Test The aptitude test will comprise of questions that could be of the Multiple-Choice type (MCQ), Multiple Select type (MSQ), Preferential Choice type (PCQ) and Numerical Answer type (NAQ) Match the following type (MFQ) The questions will carry either 1 mark,2 marks or 3 marks and 125 questions have to be answered in 180 minutes.

The medium of Aptitude test will be the English language.

The aptitude of the candidate will be assessed using some or all of the following techniques:

- Diagrammatic Reasoning Tests the ability of logical reasoning, using diagrams and scenarios
- Numerical Reasoning Tests mathematical ability through simple problems

• Abstract Reasoning – Will assess general knowledge, and ability to utilise knowledge in new situations. Questions could be asked in various topics that assess candidates on basic concepts in mathematics, physics and geometry, language and interpretation, elements and principles of design, aesthetic sensitivity, colour theory, lateral thinking and logical reasoning, visual perception and cognition, graphics and imagery, building anatomy and architectural vocabulary, basic techniques of building construction and knowledge of material, general knowledge and current affairs, etc. and are may not be limited to those outlined.

GENERAL APTITUDE

General - Objects, texture related to architecture and built environment. Interpretation of pictorial compositions, visualizing three-dimensional objects from two-dimensional drawing. Visualizing different sides of 3D objects. Analytical reasoning, mental ability (visual, numerical and verbal), General awareness of national/ International architects and famous architectural creations.

Mathematical reasoning - Statements, logical operations like and, or, if and only if, implies, implied by. Understanding of tautology, converse, contradiction and contrapositive

Sets and Relations - Idea of sets, subsets, power set, complement, union, intersection and difference of sets, Venn diagram, De Morgan's Laws, Relation and its properties. Equivalence relation — definition and elementary examples.

DRAWING TEST

The drawing aptitude is judged on the following aspects -

- Ability to sketch a given object proportionately and rendering the same in visually appealing manner;
- Visualizing and drawing the effects of light on the object and shadows cast on surroundings;

- · Combining and composing given three dimensional elements to form a building or structural form;
- · Creating interesting two dimensional composition using given shapes and forms;
- Creating visual harmony using colours in given composition;
- · Understanding of scale and proportions;
- Drawing from memory through pencil sketch on themes from day to day experiences.
- · Geometric composition, shape, building forms and elements, aesthetics, colour texture, harmony and contrast.
- Conceptualization and Visualization through structuring objects in memory.
- Drawing of patterns both geometrical and abstract.
- Form transformations in 2D and 3D like union, subtraction, rotation, surfaces and volumes.
- · Generating plan, elevation and 3D views of objects.
- Creating 2D and 3D compositions using given shape and forms.
- Sketching of urbanscape and landscape.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Candidates who have completed their 10 + 2 examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or 10+ 3 Diploma with Mathematics as subject of study can appear for NATA 2021. Candidates appearing for 10+2 examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as subjects of study or 10+3 Diploma with Mathematics in the current year may also provisionally appear for NATA.

JEE PAPER-2

About JEE (Main) is conducted twice before admissions in the next academic session. The students will have

Admission to NITs, IIITs, CFTIs, SFIs, State Engineering Colleges for Participating States and Other Participating Institutions

Eligibility for Admission to NITs, IIITs and CFTIs participating through Central Seat Allocation Board:

Admission to B.E. / B.Tech / B.Arch / B.Planning. Courses in NITs, IIITs and CFTIs participating though Central Seat Allocation Board will be based on All India Rank subject to the condition that the candidate should have secured at least 75% marks in the 12thclass examination, or be in the top 20 percentile in the 12th class / Qualifying examination conducted by the respective Boards. For SC/ST candidates the qualifying marks would be 65% in the 12th class / qualifying examination. The eligibility criteria decided by the Council of Architecture for admission to B.Arch. course other than NITs, IIITs, and CFTIs: "No candidate shall be admitted to architecture course unless she/he has passed an examination at the end of the qualifying examination with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and also 50% marks in aggregate of the qualifying examination".
