




































WHAT SHOULD YOU STUDY FOR GAT

- 1) QUANTITATIVE ABILITY: This sub-test is designed to test the quantitative ability of the candidates. The sub test consists of questions on Addition, Multiplication, Division, Fractions, Percentage, Rate of Interest, Work and Task, Ratio and Proportion, and Distance.
- 2) COMMUNICATION ABILITY: This sub-test is aimed at testing the language ability of the candidates in day to day communication in English. It includes questions on synonyms, antonyms, words with corresponding meanings, singular, plural, one word substitutes, idioms and phrases, correct spellings.
- **3) ENGLISH COMPREHENSION:** This sub-test is to test one's ability to comprehend a situation from a given passage etc.
- 4) ANALYTICAL ABILITY AND LOGICAL ABILITY: This subtest is designed to test the candidate's capacity for inference and logic from the given information and to evaluate the candidate's ability to identify the given problem and apply reasoning in solving the core issues of the problem. Concepts and practice of creative and lateral thinking are likely to be useful.
- **5) GENERAL KNOWLEDGE AND CURRENT AFFAIRS:** This sub-test is designed to test the candidate's general knowledge and current affairs.

THE DAT PRELIMS CONSISTS OF TWO PARTS

Part I: MULTIPLE-CHOICE QUESTIONS.-This part has questions with one or more than one correct answer. The responses of this part will be recorded on an OMR sheet and evaluated digitally.

EX- Which colour of the frame represents highest temperature?

Ans- Blue

Part II: SUBJECTIVE QUESTIONS, with responses to be provided in visual and/or written formats.

Ex- Draw a woman with a child crying in his arms.

Candidates should note that appearing for the DAT Prelims or being ranked in the shortlist does not guarantee automatic entitlement to admission.

STAGE 2: DESIGN APTITUDE TEST (DAT) MAINS

Candidates shortlisted after the DAT Prelims will be invited to appear for DAT Main exams at Ahmedabad or at all campuses of NID viz Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Gandhinagar, Kurukshetra,

Vijayawada, Madhya Pradesh and Assam. Exact details of the Test Centre will be mentioned in the DAT Mains Admit Card. The number of candidates shortlisted will be no less than three times the number of seats available per category in that programme

The DAT Mains for these programmes may consist of tests in multiple formats such as in a studio set up drawing/sketching, hands-on model making, group discussions, presentations, Theme based tests, Interviews and Portfolio Interactions.

FINAL MERIT LIST:

The final common merit lists for the B.Des. will be generated category wise (Open, OBC-NCL, SC, ST, PWD), based on the sum total of the weighted scores obtained by the candidate, namely the DAT Prelims and DAT Mains.

- For Indian Nationals in General Category and General EWS Category below 20 years of age as on 1 July.
- For Indian Nationals in Reserved Category (Other Backward Class-Non Creamy Layer (OBC -NCL), Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) below 23 years of age as on 1 July.
- For Indian Nationals in PWD Reserved Category below 25 years of age as on 1 July
- For Foreign Nationals in Overseas (Supernumerary) Category below 20 years of age as on 1 July.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:

Applications for current academic year are open to applicants who have passed or will appear for higher secondary (10+2) qualifying in any stream (Science, Arts, Commerce, etc.) from any recognized board of education such as CBSE, IB, ICSE or their equivalent.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:

In addition to satisfying the above age criteria, the candidate must possess at least one of the following minimum qualifications to be considered eligible for admissions:

Bachelor Degree of minimum 4-year duration in any specialization, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard from any university or institute recognised by law in India.

Condition: Candidate must have passed the Bachelor Degree examinations at the time of ocument verification tentatively scheduled in May 2023*.

OR Full-time Diploma of minimum 4-year duration in Design/Fine Arts/Applied Arts/ Architecture, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard, from any university or institute recognised by law in India. Condition: Candidates must have passed the Diploma examinations at the time of document verification tentatively scheduled in May 2023*.

OR Bachelor Degree of minimum 3-year duration in any specialization, after 12th standard or equivalent to 12th standard. Condition: Candidates must have passed the 3-year Bachelor degree examinations by August 2022.

All applicants applying for the M.Des. programme (any discipline) must fulfill criteria of both age and education qualification.

Age Limit:

NIFT SITUATION TEST

This test is about 3D model making by manipulating different material provided by the institute itself within the time limit. The material may be different types of papers, thermocol, card board, ice cream sticks, straw, strings, wire etc.

UCEED is conducted by Indian Institute of Technology Bombay. UCEED is open to all nationals (Indian/Foreign). Candidates seeking admission to the Bachelor Degree programme in Design (BDes) at Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IITB), Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD), Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (IITG), Indian Institute of Technology Hyderabad (IITH), and Indian Institute of Information Technology Design and Manufacturing Jabalpur (IIITDMJ) must appear for UCEED.

Candidates should note that the mere appearance in UCEED or being in the rank list neither guarantees nor provides any automatic entitlement to admission. UCEED qualified candidates will have to apply separately for B. Des admissions as per the prescribed procedure. Admissions shall be made in order of merit in each category. The objective of the Common Entrance Exam for Design (CEED) is to assess the candidate's aptitude for design involving visual perception ability, drawing skills, logical reasoning, creativity, communication, and problem solving skills. CEED is conducted by IIT Bombay. It is a qualifying examination for admission to Master of Design (MDes) programmes at IISc Bangalore, IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Guwahati, IIT Hyderabad, IIT Kanpur and IIITDM Jabalpur, and to Ph.Dprogrammes in Design at IISc Bangalore, IIT Bombay, IIT Guwahati, IIT Hyderabad, and IIT Kanpur. Qualifying in CEED alone does not guarantee admission to any of these programmes. Admitting institutes may conduct further tests and / or interviews for the final selection / admission. A CEED score does NOT Guarantee admission. Admitting Institutes will also verify the eligibility, the category certificates and other documents along with the CEED score. The CEED score is valid for a period of one year from the date of declaration of the result.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates must have completed a degree/diploma/post graduate degree programme of minimum THREE years (after 10+2 level), or must be appearing for the final examination of such a program by July 2023, or must have passed the GD Arts diploma programme (10+5 level) by July 2023.

Note that the eligibility criteria for admission to various institutes may differ from the eligibility criteria for appearing for CEED. Before applying for CEED, candidates are advised to check whether they meet the required eligibility criteria for admission to arious institutes.

Architecture often includes design or selection of furnishings and decorations, supervision of construction work, and the examination, restoration, or remodeling of existing buildings. As per the most popular definition Architecture: "The art or science of building; esp. the art or practice of designing and building edifices for human use, taking both aesthetic and practical factors into account." Architectural design is primarily driven by the holistically creative manipulation of mass, space, volume, texture, light, shadow, materials, program, and Realistic elements such as cost, construction and technology, in order to achieve an end which is aesthetic, functional and often artistic. This distinguishes Architecture from engineering design, which is usually driven primarily by the creative application of mathematical and scientific principles. To be a part of Architecture Course in India one has to appear in either JEE Mains PAPER II or NATA-National Aptitude Test for Architecture. These exams are monitored and administered under the guidance of Council of Architecture, India.

NATA measures the aptitude of the applicant for specific field of study, i.e. Architecture. GENERAL APTITUDE - General - Objects, texture related to architecture and built environment. Interpretation of pictorial compositions, visualizing three-dimensional objects from two-dimensional drawing. Visualizing different sides of 3D objects. Analytical reasoning, mental ability (visual, numerical and verbal), General awareness of national/ International architects and famous architectural creations.

Mathematical reasoning - Statements, logical operations like and, or, if and only if, implies, implied by. Understanding of tautology, converse, contradiction and contrapositive Sets and Relations - Idea of sets, subsets, power set, complement, union, intersection and difference of sets, Venn diagram, De Morgan's Laws, Relation and its properties. Equivalence relation — definition and elementary examples.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA - Candidates who have completed their 10 + 2 examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or 10+ 3 Diploma with Mathematics as subject of study can appear for NATA 2022. Candidates appearing for 10+2 examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as subjects of study or 10+3 Diploma with Mathematics in the current year may also provisionally appear for NATA.

JEE PAPER-2

About JEE (Main) is conducted twice (JAN & APRIL) before admissions in the next academic session. The students will have following benefits of the new pattern:

Admission to NITs, IIITs, CFTIs, SFIs, State Engineering Colleges for Participating States and Other Participating Institutions

Eligibility for Admission to NITs, IIITs and CFTIs participating through **Central Seat Allocation Board**:

Admission to B.E. / B.Tech / B.Arch / B.Planning. Courses in NITs, IIITs and CFTIs participating though Central Seat Allocation Board will be based on All India Rank subject to the condition that the candidate should have secured at least 75% marks in the 12thclass examination, or be in the top 20 percentile in the 12th class / Qualifying examination conducted by the respective Boards. For SC/ST candidates the qualifying marks would be 65% in the 12th class / qualifying examination.
